Fusion celebrated 50 years of business in 2021. Unfortunately, due to the Coronavirus pandemic, we were unable to celebrate in our 50th year and had to postpone the celebrations until this year. This gave us the opportunity to bring together our colleagues, past and present, customers, clients and partners for a showcase exhibition and gala dinner event, and we were delighted that so many made the journey from all over the world to celebrate with us.

On Thursday 28th April 2022 we held an exhibition for our customers and clients at the DoubleTree by Hilton. Sheffield Park. Included on the day was an interactive exhibition, a Fusion Assist demonstration and a site tour of our premises at Chesterfield. Thursday closed with a networking evening and buffet at the DoubleTree which allowed our customers to relax with some food and drink and share thoughts and ideas with Fusion staff and other customers.

After a busy few days travelling and spending time at the exhibition, Friday morning allowed our customers some down time. They had the opportunity to take part in various activities including a visit to Chatsworth House and gardens or taking a walk in the Peak District.

This was a chance for some of our overseas customers to get to experience the local surroundings and some highlights of Derbyshire and South Yorkshire.

Friday evening was time for the main event! We celebrated the Fusion 50th Gala dinner at The Devonshire Dome in Buxton, a truly magnificent venue in the heart of Derbyshire.

Over 300 people were in attendance including employees and partners, ex-employees, customers, and some VIP guests.



Two of the VIP guests included Her **Worship The Mayor of Chesterfield** Councillor Glenys Falconer and her Consort, Councillor Keith Falconer.

The evening started with canapés and fizz upon arrival, which was followed by a 3-course meal. Throughout the evening there were speeches from senior figures throughout Fusion's 50 vears and a silent auction also took place with some fantastic lots up for grabs. The showcase event held on Thursday was split into 3 main features; an interactive walkthrough exhibition, a live demonstration of our mobile app **Fusion Assist and a tour of our** manufacturing and testing facilities in Chesterfield.

The interactive exhibition took customers through the Fusion journey, starting in 1971, ending in the present then looking to the future. On display were some of the original equipment and products that were made and used early in our history in the 1970's

and 80's. Specially made rigs of pipe and products ushered visitors around the room moving from old to new.

Halfway through the exhibition there was an opportunity for customers to manually wind the coated resistance wire onto a coupler core, which was the original method used to produce an electrofusion coupler before the development of automated winding. The groups of visitors really enjoyed assessing each other's attempts at winding, some were definitely better than others...

The exhibition then moved from manufacturing excellence into how our products are prepared and installed on piping systems. There were examples of Electrofusion and Butt Fusion good practice as well as a rig showcasing how our products can provide the perfect solution within water and gas pipeline systems.

Our AVK colleagues were on hand with products from their offer including the Pentobox and valves used for gas and water. This area showcased the great synergy between the businesses and how we have

been working together in new product development. The customers were then able to ask any questions they had to our experts, who were on hand to support.

In a separate room from the exhibition, **Stephen Tann**, Group Technical Manager delivered an interactive Fusion Assist demonstration, showing how the app is used and how it can help our customers with the traceability of their assets. As well as traceability, customers could download the app on their own devices and see some of our products in Augmented Reality (AR).

The demonstration received some excellent feedback and we hope the app will help resolve some of the issues our customers may be facing.



### Site Tour



The final element of the day was a tour of our world-class manufacturing and testing facilities.

The tour involved a walk around Fusamatic with talks from General Manager Paul Brecker and Operations Manager Neil Allman. The tour showcased some of the robots and automation that are used to manufacture our products on site.

Customers were able to experience the whole manufacturing process flow from raw materials, component preparation, socket and tapping tee manufacture, through to final inspection, packaging and despatch. Customers took the opportunity to ask questions as they walked around the 'shop floor'.

The customers then had the opportunity to visit our world-class

testing facilities and were hosted by Group Director Lisa Shelton and Test Laboratory Manager Shawn Shelton. They explained the Test Laboratory capability and how our products go through various stages of testing to meet a number of industry product standards and test methods around the world. They then demonstrated material tests, decohesion tests, and examples of good and bad electrofusion welding.

Several customers were even challenged to knock a correctly installed tapping tee off a pipe (unsuccessfully), and then carry out the same challenge on a poorly installed tapping tee with greater success. This was to demonstrate the importance of correct installation practices.

The tour was also made available to some of our non-English speaking

visitors through translators. The tour was kindly translated into Polish, Indonesian, Turkish and Italian so that everyone could fully understand what was being discussed during the tour.

A truly fantastic evening was had by all. The evening showcased exactly what Fusion is, and has been about for its 50 year life, truly great people and spirit.


It was a fitting celebration to mark 50 years of Fusion from all those who have worked so hard over the years to make the business successful.


